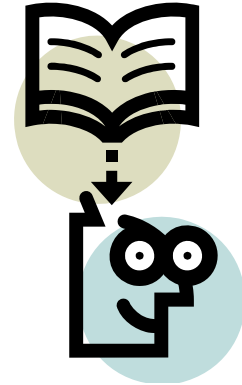

Dr. Thomas Peacock, facilitator of the workshop, brings a wealth of experience to Troy University in Tampa. He earned his M.Ed and Ed.D. in Administration, Planning and Social Policy while on scholarship at Harvard University in Cambridge.

He has years of administrative experience as a secondary school principal and superintendent of schools. He has taught fourteen (14) years in university settings; nine (9) years as co-director of the University of Minnesota Duluth's Ed.D. program in educational leadership.

Dr. Peacock has authored seven books and speaks at regional and national Native education conferences each year. His books include Collected Wisdom: American Indian Education, The Seventh Generation, A Forever Story; The People and Community of the Fond du Lac Reservation, Ojibwe: Waasa Inaabidaa We Look in All Directions, The Good Path, The Four Hills of Life, and To Be Free: Understanding and Eliminating Racism.
